HOPKINTON SOCCER OPPORTUNITIES

HSC, HYSA, & Hopkinton School District

FALL 2012



Three organizations provide soccer opportunities for Hopkinton's youth, the Hopkinton Soccer Club (HSC) the Hopkinton Youth Sports Association (HYSA), and starting at 7th grade, the Hopkinton School District (Middle School Soccer). Both HSC and HYSA are non-profit organizations run exclusively by volunteers. While the principal goal of each organization is the enrichment of our community's youth, each offers different approaches and emphasis.

HSC is a travel soccer club that offers a competitive soccer program year round. All coaches are licensed for the respective age group. Players are selected at tryouts which attempt to evaluate soccer skill, athletic ability, and player attitude. Not all who tryout will make the team.

HYSA offers recreational fall soccer for all Hopkinton youth who sign up. HYSA creates balanced teams with no tryouts required. HYSA teams emphasize fair play, sportsmanship and equal playing time for all. HYSA does not offer indoor or spring soccer.

Middle School Soccer, HSC, and HYSA offer valuable opportunities for our youth. We hope that parents and coaches will communicate this fact to all youth who participate in one or both of these programs. Player attitude and fair play are prime goals of both organizations. The "better" program is the one that best suits your child's needs.

Girls: U-10* to U-12 (ages 9-11 – as of Aug 1st) June 11 and June 12 at Houston Fields - 5:00 to 7:00 PM

Boys: U-10* to U-14 (ages 9-13 – as of Aug 1st) and Girls U13/U14 June 13 and June 14 at Houston Fields - 5:00 to 7:00 PM

* U-10 teams are the youngest that HSC sponsors. However, younger players may tryout for a spot on a U-10 team.

REGISTRATION:

Tuesday June 19th at Hopkinton High School from 5:00 to 6:30 PM

COST:

\$120 for session fees. Uniforms are to be purchased by players. Scholarships are available.

HSC conducts OPEN TRYOUTS before fall registration for the upcoming soccer year. This means that a player who has played for HSC the previous year IS NOT GUARANTEED a position for the next soccer year. Although skill is an important factor, selection of a player is not based on soccer skill alone. Player loyalty, commitment, contribution, spirit, hard work, athletic ability, attitude, maturity, and cooperation all play an important role in player selection and team success. Ultimately, player selection is made by the head coach, often after discussion with other coaches and board members who were involved in the tryout process.

HSC programs typically practice twice per week with games on the weekends.

HYSA strives to form balanced teams of equal ability. Pre-School through 2nd grade is coed and teams play other Hopkinton teams only. These programs are Saturday Mornings only. 3rd through 6th grade boys and girls play separately with games or practices occurring approximately 3-4 times per week including weekends. 7th and 8th grade is often coed based on number of players. HYSA teams play competitive games against similarly formed teams through the Merrimack Valley Soccer League (MVSL) including Henniker,

Hillsborough, Weare, Bradford, Warner, Sunapee, New London, Bow and Concord (Rundlett School). **For more information about**

The Hopkinton School District has Middle School Teams that play surrounding Middle Schools in a competitive interscholastic league. The Middle School program runs practices and games immediately after school with weekends off. Both HSC and HYSA encourage all eligible players (current 6th and 7th graders) to play for and support our Middle School teams. Middle School tryouts typically occur just before school starts in late August and sign-ups remain open until the start of the school year. Players not making the Middle School team may sign up with HYSA's 7-8th grade team after the Middle School tryout. HSC is planning to run a U14 competitive team in the fall. Players making this team are encouraged to also play for Middle School teams. The HSC U14 team will be selected in June and will primarily run on weekends to avoid conflicts with Middle School Soccer.
